
Barn Hunt Seminar

We had to put Maddie to sleep on Monday. She has been having trouble for about the last seven months. I have tried desperately to find out what was wrong with her.

Since February we have been to the emergency clinic twice and follow-up visits at my vet. She had X-rays and more X-rays. They kept telling me it was her arthritis. Then two weeks ago I finally had the vet take a full blood chemistry, and he said she had Pancreatitis. He gave me I/D food, but it didn't work for her. We went back and they told me it may take one or two months to see improvement. Last Thursday she just went down, so Friday I admitted her. They had her on IV for three days, and called me on Monday because her numbers were not getting any better. They repeated an ultrasound, and he told me there were masses on her liver, and it was not realistic to biopsy or do chemotherapy.

I just wanted to thank you so much for lending Maddie to me. She was a perfect match for me and my husband. We are very sad.



## For Your Information

### ACUPUNCTURE/LASER THERAPY --Alternatives to Surgery

Ellie joined our family in 2010 from ARADV--healthy, beautiful, and ready to share her passion of ball playing. After about 1 1/2 years of this level of activity we began to notice that she had some yelpy moments when climbing stairs and jumping on HER sofa. She also was chewing on her feet and legs...all signs of pain. Our vet treated her with anti-inflammatory meds and laser therapy. She improved.

However, several months later symptoms returned but more frequent and more serious. She also became more lethargic. We headed to neurosurgeons in Virginia. Their MRI revealed a severely herniated disk in her lower back and surgery was discussed. A second non-surgery option that we chose was Acupuncture and pain meds. Research indicated that the surgery in larger dogs was not as successful as we had hoped it to be.

We immediately came home and found a certified Acupuncture vet and began weekly treatments. We alternated between laser therapy and Acupuncture but found that Acupuncture gave us the best results and continued with only Acupuncture and pain meds. The last six months we have been able to go as long as two weeks between sessions.

The results of Acupuncture are immediate...you can see her begin to relax while still in the office and she often falls asleep on the trip home. Good days follow with an active, relatively pain-free Dale.

Ellie is a good patient. She receives a piece of cheese as each needle (about 1 inch long) is inserted. She doesn't seem to notice the insertion...no obvious discomfort. She then lays down for about 25 minutes and works on a rawhide chew or bully stick while the needles "do their thing.". It may take more than one session to see results...some depending on the anxiousness of the dog.

The Acupuncture does not interfere with any of her meds nor does it negatively affect her or-



gans. The procedure stimulates release of her body's own pain relieving endorphins and antiinflammatory substances. It also increases relaxation of muscles.

The procedure costs us \$50 per session. Many vet offices now have certificated Acupuncturist.

With these procedures (Acupuncture, laser therapy, and pain medications) we have a happy Airedale with few limitations, anxiously awaiting the next "Let's Play Ball" session.




### We Get Letters

Surprisingly, Tobey recovered faster, but both took it in stride, better than Bill when he had his knee surgery!
